



Advancing Cardiac Care with the EP-Tracer Mobile System

We are proud to announce a major enhancement to our Electrophysiology (EP) services with the acquisition of the EP-Tracer mobile recording and mapping system. Under the leadership of Dr. Ali Sovari and our skilled EP team, this innovative technology was recently used to perform one of the first cases at St. John's, marking a new chapter in how we deliver heart rhythm care.

The portable EP-Tracer system offers exceptional flexibility, enabling complex cardiac procedures to be conducted efficiently across multiple lab spaces. This advancement not only improves workflow and resource use but also expands patient access to cutting-edge electrophysiology care. With this addition, St. John's reinforces its commitment to providing the highest quality cardiovascular treatment for our community, ensuring patients benefit from the latest technology close to home.

Celebrating 50 Years of St. John's Hospital Camarillo

This year we celebrated the 50th anniversary of St. John's Hospital Camarillo. The celebration brought together caregivers, community members, and leaders in gratitude for all who have shaped our hospital's legacy. Outback Steakhouse of Oxnard generously provided lunch for our employees.

We were honored to welcome Archbishop José H. Gomez, who joined us to commence the occasion with a blessing that acknowledged both our history and our future.

From the opening of the hospital doors in 1974 and merging with St. John's in 1993, St. John's Camarillo has grown to meet the needs of our region with programs in cardiology, cancer care, emergency medicine, rehabilitation, and more. We remain committed to expanding services, enhancing technology, and ensuring that Ventura County families continue to have access to high-quality care without leaving the community they call home. We look forward to the next 50 years of service in Camarillo.

A Heart for Comfort: Emergency Department Ambassadors

In the middle of the fast-paced, high-stakes environment of the Emergency Department at St. John's Hospital Camarillo, there is a quiet source of calm and compassion: the Emergency Department Ambassador team. These volunteers ensure that no patient feels alone during what can be one of the most stressful moments of their life.

The program began in 2016, when longtime volunteer and hospital supporter Joseph ("Joe") Muklevicz, inspired by the vision of Medical Director Dr. Jeffery Davies, recognized the difference a simple act of presence could make.

What started with one person offering to observe quickly grew into a team of volunteers dedicated to listening, reassuring, and bringing comfort alongside the medical care patients receive.

Drawing on his organizational background, Joe welcomed and led others who shared his belief in the power of human connection, growing the team to 22 volunteer Ambassadors before the pandemic temporarily paused their service.



When the program restarted last year, Ambassadors were eager to return. Today, they can be found helping families find their way, reading with children, or simply sitting with someone who needs company.

The hospital's mission to provide compassionate, patient-centered care is at the heart of the program. While physicians and nurses focus on medical treatment, Ambassadors meet a different, equally important need by easing anxiety, lifting spirits, and ensuring that no one faces a difficult moment alone.

The dedication of the volunteer Ambassadors continues to enrich the experience of patients, families, and the culture of the Emergency Department itself.

As a reflection of the Muklevicz family's long history of supporting the hospital and community, a room in St. John's Hospital Camarillo has been named in memory of Joe's late wife, a tribute to the love and kindness that continues to inspire.

For Joe and the other Ambassadors, the experience of volunteering is deeply meaningful. Joe often shares that volunteering has shown him how much of a difference even the smallest act can make. For those with a warm heart and a willingness to give their time, the experience is impactful and rewarding.

We are thankful for Joe's leadership and the generosity of every Emergency Department Ambassador who chooses to spend their time bringing comfort to community members in need. Their presence turns anxious moments into ones of connection and reassurance, and their kindness is felt long after patients leave our care.

Turning Loss Into Motion: A Gift That Keeps Patients Moving

At our Outpatient Therapy Center in Oxnard, every step toward recovery matters. Every turn of the pedal does, too.

Thanks to the generosity of one grateful former patient and the compassion of a new board member, our rehabilitation team recently welcomed a StepOne Recumbent Stepper to the center. It's even more than therapeutic equipment; it is a symbol of love, community, and the power of collective giving.

Tom came to us for outpatient rehab after an illness that temporarily set him back.

Through hard work and the support of our dedicated team, he regained strength and mobility. Not long after completing therapy, Tom experienced a devastating loss with the passing of his beloved wife, Barbara. In the midst of his grief, he found a meaningful way to honor her memory: instead of flowers, he asked friends and family to donate to the therapy center that helped him heal.

The heartfelt donations poured in and quickly added up. By the end, only \$2,000 remained to reach the goal. That is when Harriet Friedman, a new member of our board and a multiple-time cancer survivor, stepped in to close the gap. Inspired by Tom's story and the difference rehab had made in his life, she made sure the bike became a reality.

With wheelchair access, step-through seating, and supportive design, the StepOne Recumbent Stepper is already transforming rehabilitation at St. John's. Patients of all abilities can use it safely.

The machine is ideal for stroke, orthopedic, and neurologic patients with muscle weakness or balance issues. It mimics natural walking and climbing, helping patients rebuild strength, coordination, and balance for daily activities. For stroke patients, independent arm and leg movement allow for targeted training. For those with mobility challenges, it provides safe, seated cardiovascular exercise to improve endurance, circulation, and heart health.

A single stepper now stands as a testament to love, resilience, and a community that cares.
